THE PASTOR'S PORTICO

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, in which our Lord manifests himself to the nations, represented by the magi. Even though the world stopped celebrating Christmas on December 25th, we know that the splendor and awe of Christmas reaches its climax in the feast of Epiphany. On this feast of Epiphany, we too have seen the Lord! Therefore, "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you" (Isaiah 60:1). As the star rose in the East and brought the Magi to Christ, so too we must now imitate the star in its humble service (c.f. St. Leo the Great). Today's Epiphany presents us with Our Lord's divinity, and we should come to understand that his saving work is available to all.

Tomorrow, we conclude the Christmas Season but celebrating the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In the Gospel we hear the voice of the Father say, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." While these words are spoken directly of Jesus, they were also spoken of us on the day of our own baptism. St. Gregory of Nazianzus says, "He [Christ] wants you to become a living force for all mankind, lights shining in the world. You are to be radiant lights as you stand beside Christ, the great light, bathed in the glory of him who is the light of heaven." We all know the day we were born (birthday date), but do we know the day we were re-born into eternal life (baptismal date)? If you do, great, be sure to celebrate it with as much joy as you would your birthday. If you do not, I would like to challenge you to find out and begin celebrating it this year. In addition, we can receive a Plenary Indulgence (all normal conditions needing to be met) by renewing our Baptismal Promises on that day; never let an opportunity of grace go to waste!

As many of you have noted, we have done extremely well in our previous three collections: \$8,207.00 (December 18), \$16,208.00 (December 25), and \$9,312.00 (January 1). As a result, we were able to purchase two \$15,000.00, 1-year cashable GICs at a rate of 4.6% through Meridian. These will be used for capital projects in the future. Thank you again for your continued commitment to parish life, we would not be able to do all the amazing things we do, without your generosity and kindness.

Beyond Words

Have you ever met a "big time" celebrity? Maybe you spotted a famous actor or actress in an airport or got an autograph from a well-known athlete. Perhaps you got a selfie with a famous musician or shook hands with a big-name star. Maybe you had a celebrity "like" your tweet or respond to a post. If you have, you remember how excited you were. If you haven't, imagine how you'd feel if someone you really looked up to or admired all of a sudden was face-to-face with you. It'd be pretty epic, right? Like a day you would never forget. Would you feel excited? Commit the moment to your memory? Take 100 selfies? Refuse to wash your hands ever again?

Would you be "overjoyed"? Would your joy reach excessive levels which you've never experienced?

The magi were excited when they saw a star, too, but for very different reasons. The star they beheld was one filled with both promise and mystery. The heavenly orb led them to an even greater heavenly reality in a manger. The Prophet Isaiah told us it was going to happen, but it was the Gentiles (non-Jews) who cracked this code. Their arrival and imminent worship did more than reveal the baby's royal identity; it revealed the depth and breadth of God's plan to save us. Jesus was coming for everyone, not just the "chosen" Jewish people.

Did you catch that? The wise men thought they were seeking the Lord only to realize that the God of the universe (not even "their" god") was actually the one seeking *them*! In the second reading we hear how this beautiful mystery was being made known and we are all invited to behold this mystery, to contemplate it, and to celebrate it. If the fact that God came to save you from death does not fill you with indescribable joy, it may be time to ponder this fact on your knees before the God of the universe, just like the magi did. Jesus is waiting in the tabernacle. Show up, bring your gifts, and follow in their oh-so-wise footsteps.

Random Fact

Scripture never names the magi. In fact, the Bible doesn't even say there are three "kings," only three gifts. Tradition tells us (through St. Bede) that the names of the magi are Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Gaspar is often depicted as a younger, beardless, and red-haired man. Melchior is usually seen as an older man with white hair and long white beard. Balthazar is normally depicted as a middle-aged man of dark complexion with a heavy beard.

Behind the Scenes

It can be difficult for us to truly appreciate how challenging St. Paul's mission was within the early Church. Trained as a (Jewish) Rabbi but called to be "the apostle to the Gentiles," St.



Paul had the unenviable task of evangelizing the non-Jews and welcoming them into God's chosen family amidst Jews who, from birth, hated them. On top of that, prior to St. Paul's conversion, he (Saul) was the one hunting down the new Christians and condemning them to death. It's easy to see why St. Paul had few friends who completely trusted him when his missionary work began and had enemies everywhere who felt he had lost his mind or sacrificed his soul.

This backdrop makes the second reading even more impressive. Saint Paul tells the Ephesians that the Gentiles are not merely "tacked on" to God's open door to salvation but equal to God's chosen people, the Jews, as "co-heirs, members of the same body" (Ephesians 3:6). Saint Paul is not giving the Gentiles a lower status but one equal in stature before God and man. Given this background on the second reading, one can more easily see why the Church, in her wisdom, decided to place this epistle within the cycle of readings for Epiphany Sunday.

Word Play

The word *epiphany* comes from the Latin *epiphania* meaning, "to reveal." For the first several centuries of the Church it was actually the Feast of Epiphany, even more than Christmas, that celebrated the "revelation" of the Incarnation. Epiphany Sunday is a celebration of the reality that God took flesh at an appointed time in history and that God was announcing and offering salvation to *all*, not just the chosen people of Israel.

Journal

- 1. The Savior of the world seeks you. How can you present yourself to Him? Go to the chapel? Go to Mass? Pray more frequently?
- 2. Through the sacraments, specifically Baptism and Confirmation, God gives us spiritual gifts to help us build His kingdom. What gifts do you have that you can use for His glory?

Challenge for the Week

The best way to encounter Jesus is to go to Mass. The Mass is the closest we can be to God on Earth. This week, pick a day to go to daily Mass. Show up where Christ is sure to be, just like the magi showed up at the Nativity. If you cannot attend a daily Mass, go to an adoration chapel near you to pray when you are available. The first step of prayer is to actually show up.
