THE PASTOR'S PORTICO

Today we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Lent traditional known as *Laetare Sunday* (*Rejoice Sunday*), when the Church takes a bit of breather from Lenten practice and opens Mass with the Entrance Antiphon, "*Rejoice, Jerusalem...Be joyful, all who were in mourning!*" – cf. Isaiah 66.

On both *Laetare Sunday* and *Gaudete Sunday*, a priest may wear rose vestments. The color rose is used as a sign of the joy which characterizes these two Sundays. The use of rose vestments probably stems from an ancient papal tradition of blessing golden roses which would be sent to Catholic heads of state in Europe on the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

It is good to mark this mid-way point of Lent with a celebration. Perhaps a Sunday brunch with some roses on the table...or perhaps maybe even planting a rose bush, for you greener thumbs. A traditional practice is visiting your "mother church", the place where you were baptized. Whatever it is you are doing to celebrate, make sure you do it with much rejoicing!

This coming week we will be having a special Mass in honour of the Solemnity of St. Joseph. This Mass will be on Monday, March 20th at 7:00 p.m. If you are in the habit of having bread or baked goods blessed, please feel free to bring these along as well. You can never go wrong with a Zeppole di San Giuseppe!

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. It was first celebrated in the fourth or fifth century. This feast celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son. From all eternity, God destined her to be the mother of Jesus. Does this mean it was forced upon her? Absolutely not! We know that Mary, of her own free will, said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Her one yes changed the world! The annual Respect for Life Mass will take place at the Cathedral on the Vigil of the Annunciation (March 24) at 7:00 p.m., all are welcome. Also, please consider undertaking a spiritual adoption, in which you will be praying for an unborn child, who is in most need of your prayers.

Beyond Words

For what purpose were you created? What vocation did God place within you to fulfill?

Many walk through life in darkness, unable to answer either of the previous questions. Once we come to know God as Father through our Baptism and begin to seek and discern His will for our lives, the darkness fades away and we walk in the light. Saint Paul illuminates (no pun intended) this point beautifully for the Ephesians in this week's second reading. For just as the man born blind only finally "sees" thanks to Christ in the Gospel passage, we only come to understand life's purpose and our role within God's plan of salvation by way of Christ and His sacraments. Just as the miraculous healing of Christ points us to our Baptism, David's anointing in the first reading also has an almost sacramental feel to it. While Confirmation did not exist in its current understanding in the time of David, the anointing with oil and "the spirit of the Lord" rushing upon the young man certainly has sacramental undertones and foreshadowing.

While you may not yet fully comprehend what your future holds — what you are to do or who you are to become — the great news, as echoed in the psalm, is that you have nothing to fear. If you know, love, and serve God, He will be with you, at your side, to go before you and cast His light into all darkness. You need not fear; you need only say "yes." God's plan for you is perfect and far better than anything you could ever come up with on your own.

Random Fact

Saint John tells us that Jesus' spit mixed with the dirt forms "clay" which is then placed upon the blind man's eyes. Not coincidentally, what was used in Genesis by God to form and breathe life into the first man? Clay. This healing is more than a cool party trick but a rebirth, a baptism of sorts; the man has become a new creation in Christ.

Behind the Scenes

Many have a tendency to look at Scripture stories as either strictly symbolic or strictly historical, but to put them into just one category is short-sighted and intrinsically flawed. While there are varying ways to read and interpret Scripture, several stories — like this week's Gospel — are simultaneously historical and factual while also symbolic and analogical.

Non-biblical Jewish and Roman writers and historians attest to the fact that there was a wonder worker from Nazareth — an itinerant preacher — who had a large following and reportedly worked miracles and healings like opening the eyes of the blind which no one



could mirror or explain. Historically speaking, we have eyewitness testimony that Christ healed the blind which puts this story in a literal, historical light (also, no pun intended).

Taking an even deeper, sacramental look (as St. John always invites us to do), however, we see (this pun very much intended) in the blind man something even more amazing. This is a story of baptism. The man born blind encounters God. The water that comes from God is used to destroy the darkness, remove his blindness, and usher him into the light of life, just like Baptism removes our Original Sin. When he washes in the pool of "the one Sent," he can see and goes forth to bear witness to the truth he has experienced. So this story functions on both a historical and symbolic/sacramental level, simultaneously.

Word Play

Bethlehem was a small village about five miles south of Jerusalem. The hometown of Ruth's husband, Boaz and King David (and his family), Bethlehem comes from a Hebrew phrase literally meaning "House of Bread." A fitting name for the city that also served as the birthplace of Jesus, our Bread of Life.


