THE PASTOR'S PORTICO

It is absolutely mind blowing to think that we will be beginning the Season of Lent this week with Ash Wednesday (February 22nd). This year, ashes will be distributed according to the usual custom, which is on the forehead; please do join us if you are able. If you prefer (or require) an evening Mass, there will be one at the Cathedral at 7:00 p.m. There will be no evening Mass here as to not disturb the evening confessions.

During Lent, the liturgy prepares catechumens and candidates to celebrate the Paschal Mystery by various stages of Christian Initiation. This year, we will be receiving one person into the Church at the Easter vigil, which is very exciting for us as a parish family! In addition, Lent has two major purposes for those already in the Church: it recalls our baptism and emphasizes a spirit of penance. I would encourage everyone to make at least one good confession during the Season of Lent (Please see the front of the bulletin for confession times).

Also, during the Season of Lent, each Friday we recall our Blessed Lord's final days through the Stations of the Cross. These will be held each Friday morning at 7:30 a.m. This will allow those who would like to come to stations but cannot come in the evening, a chance to participate. If you would prefer the evening, please visit the Cathedral.

OFFICE OF THE BISHOP Lent 2023

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On December 28, 2022, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, issued an Apostolic Letter marking the 400th anniversary of the death of St. Francis de Sales. The document, entitled *Totum Amoris Est*, is a beautiful reflection on this wonderful saint.

St. Francis de Sales was the Bishop of Geneva during the Reformation. The city had embraced the schismatic teachings of John Calvin. St. Francis de Sales' approach was not typical of the time. Rather than use words that condemned, he struck a conciliatory tone by teaching the truth with gentleness and love to these people. He once said 'you can attract more flies with a spoonful of honey rather than a barrel full of vinegar'. Many people returned to the faith because he offered the sweet honey of God's love, rather than the sour vinegar of harsh condemnation. At the time of his death, many had returned to the Catholic Faith.

In his Apostolic Letter, Pope Francis refers to one of St. Francis de Sales' great spiritual works entitled "Introduction to the Devout Life". A significant theme found in this book is what the Second Vatican Council has called, 'the universal call to holiness'. St. Francis understood that we are called to a life of true devotion wherever we may find ourselves in the world. He states, "Devotion must be practiced differently by the gentleman, the craftsman, the chamberlain, the prince, the widow, the young woman, the wife" (Introduction to the Devout Life). Commenting on this quote, Pope Francis states, "To live in the midst of the secular city while nurturing the interior life, to combine the desire for perfection with every state of life, and to discover an interior peace that does not separate us from the world but teaches us how to live in it and to appreciate it, but also to maintain proper detachment from it. That was the aim of Francis de Sales, and it remains a valuable lesson for men and women in our own time" (*Totum Amoris Est*).

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. It provides us with an opportunity, as Pope Francis states, "to live in the midst of the secular city while nurturing the interior life". We have an opportunity to grow in holiness by embracing the three traditional pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as a means of spiritual transformation during Lent. We can also attend daily Mass and make the effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance, especially if it has been a long time. On Saturday, March 25, this sacrament will be offered in all our parishes throughout the diocese from ten o'clock in the morning until two o'clock in the afternoon.

I also recommend that you do some spiritual reading this Lent. Perhaps you could read Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, *Totum Amoris Est* (twelve pages) or one of the books of St. Francis de Sales such as "Introduction to the Devout Life" or another beautiful book "Treatise on the Love of God". They are timeless treasures that help us respond to God's call to holiness.

It is my hope and prayer that all our Lenten efforts will move us to have a greater love for God and neighbour for "the measurement of love is to love without measure" (Treatise on Divine Love).

Frenemies

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Love your enemies."

Opening Prayer

God, you are love. Everything you are contains an unfathomable amount of love. You are love in its purest way. You are selfless and humble. I, as your child, am called to love as you love — not only my friends, but my enemies. Lord, give me the grace to love those who are hard to love. Help others see you in me as I love them like you. Amen.

Beyond Words

In this week's Gospel we hear Jesus speaking as simply and plainly as He possibly can. It's as though He's saying, "Look, it's not impressive to love people who are nice to you and whom you like back. I mean even an atheist can do that. No, what sets you apart is how you love those people who can't stand you or who you cannot stand."

Think about that.

That's the measure of your love ... how well you love the person who is rude to you online or in line. How kind you are to the person who rolls their eyes at you, who gets frustrated with you, or who flips you off in traffic. The law put forth in Leviticus (first reading) warned the people not only against the dangers of hatred but even stipulates for them never to hold a grudge.

Think about that.

The psalm reminds us how God pardons us. Would you like the Lord to only offer you the same amount of mercy you offer to others? Psalm 103 takes the whole "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" to an even deeper level. Forgiveness is not a one-time thing, it's a daily thing.

Think about that.

If you belong to Christ and you are a walking tabernacle (second reading), you need to consider who you are in light of Whose you are. Holiness is simple but not easy. Step one, don't think too highly of yourself. Loving God, first, helps with that. Step two, don't think too little of others. Loving your enemies helps with that.

Random Fact

Jesus tells His followers that if someone "presses you into service for one mile, go two miles." At that time Palestine was under Roman occupation and rule. By law, a Roman soldier could force anyone to have to carry his equipment (if he wanted a break or needed a rest) for up to one mile. Jews could be pressed into service against their will. Here, Jesus is telling them not only not to resist but, if pressed, to offer to go "the extra mile" for the other ... even an enemy.

Behind the Scenes

In this week's Gospel passage, Jesus is giving new context to old laws. Borrowing heavily from the Old Testament, Jesus is calling His followers to get above and beyond what they



were accustomed to doing. "An eye for an eye" was seen as legal retribution in the time of Moses. Jews were allowed to ask for and seek restitution from someone who had wronged them. Jesus, instead, challenges people to forgive wrongdoing.

Likewise, when you've been struck on your right cheek and you offer your left, the person striking you would be forced to use the back of their right hand. The Mishnah (the written out version of the Jewish oral law/traditions), however, explained that a back-handed slap was far more egregious and insulting a practice and the victim was entitled to twice the compensation. Jesus encourages His followers to seek neither the normal nor the inflated restitution.

The tunic example also demonstrates the willingness to forego legal rights by refusing to make a claim against someone else and, instead, offering them even more. This is not God encouraging us to be victimized or abused but, instead, for us to look toward the care for others more than ourselves.

Word Play

Perfect? How can Jesus expect us to be "perfect"? When Jesus says, "be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect" He is not saying He expects us never to sin or fall in our humanity. The Lord is calling us to imitate God the Father in how we love. Jesus is challenging us to become more loving, more merciful, and more other-centered just as God is, always has been, and forever will be.

Journal

- 1. Think about the person in your life that is really hard to love (who may have come to mind while reading Beyond Words). How is God calling you to love that person? Is it by engaging them in conversation? Is it by forgiving them for something they did in the past? Is it by praying a special intention for them every day?
- 2. In Isaiah, God calls us not to just give what is needed but to go above and beyond what is asked of us. How can you go above and beyond in service?
- 3. In the last line of Matthew, we hear, "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." What does it mean to be perfect, not in a worldly sense, but a spiritual sense? How is God calling you to perfection?

Challenge for the Week

It takes a lot of self-discipline in order to love those who are hard to love. If we let ourselves and our emotions go, we can lose what we are aiming for which is love. In the spirit of Lent right around the corner, work on self-discipline by fasting from something. It can be social media, sweets, you name it. It must be something that will take work though. Do not give up video games if you do not play video games!
